Rich survived a severe airplane crash and was treated for his burn injuries and traumatic brain injury at the Oregon Burn Center. Pam listened to Rich and introduced him to the upcoming stages of his recovery process. Rich was so appreciative of her friendship and the hope she brought him during visits that he later trained to become a burn survivor peer supporter through the Phoenix SOAR program.

Today, Rich has made it his mission to be there for other burn survivors, listen, and help guide them and their families to cope with and begin their recovery journey. He finds participating in a survivor's burn recovery as a trained Peer Supporter very rewarding. Peer support allows him to help the "newbies" and long-time survivors alike develop their own approach for successful and productive burn recovery.
